



Charitable Status

NGFDG has initialised the process of applying to become a registered charity.

Since starting in May 2005 we have grown to the extent that we now have over 130 members with 7 teams and 26 qualified coaches.

However, continuing to provide good quality facilities, equipment and kit for such a large group is not cheap – especially when we want to keep the costs for individual members as affordable as possible.

Up until now we have been very successful in raising funds within NGFDG (e.g. through sponsored events, weekly lottery) and have also managed to attract external funding for some of our activities (e.g. Sense Over Sectarianism, BT Community Champions, Show Racism the Red Card).

But there is a limit on our access to external funding as there are many sources which can only give financial support to charitable bodies. Consequently there are certain things which we have been unable to achieve.

By becoming a registered charity we will be able to:

- **tap those funding sources (e.g. charitable foundations) which can only give financial support to charitable bodies**
- **receive donations from companies which can claim tax relief under the Gift Aid scheme for gifts of money to charities**
- **maximise the financial return from donations from individual donors through Gift Aid or Payroll Giving**

This is a very important step for us all as it opens up whole new opportunities and potential funding for the ongoing development and strengthening of NGFDG and hopefully we will start to see the practical benefits of this in the not too distant future.

CLUB LOTTERY

Since the Lottery started again in August, we have had 2 lucky winners matching 3 numbers. Chris Campbell, one of our longest serving players has had the 2nd highest win this year, pocketing £550 and new player Chris Patrick has just won a cool £600!

The funds generated by the Lottery are really important. Without this fund-raising, it would be impossible to meet all our club commitments. Thanks for all your support. We would be grateful if everyone would make a concerted effort to get as many of their friends and family supporting the Lottery as is possible, the more money raised means a potential bigger jackpot!
